### Burkina Faso: support for general strike

Brussels, 7 February 2005 (ICFTU OnLine): The ICFTU expressed its full backing for calls made by its affiliated organisations in Burkina Faso - CSB and ONSL - for a 24-hour stoppage on Friday 4 February to support demands for a wage review.

Sixty thousand public sector employees across the country participated in the "warning strike" and some 5000 workers brought the capital city to a standstill when they marched through the streets of Ouagadougou to protest against high living costs and the government's attitude.

The ICFTU warmly welcomed the united front of the six national trade union organisations and 12 independent trade unions who called the strike. The stoppage was the natural follow up to the marches and protest meetings called by the same organisations on 18 December 2004 in support of a claims package including a 25% rise in wages and pensions, tax cuts - particularly on fuel products - and the prompt reconstruction of Ouagadougou's central market, burnt down in 2003.

Following the trade union action on 18 December 2004, the government had announced a series of wage increase measures on 29 December. The trade unions, however, consider that the proposed measures (wage increases ranging from 4.5 to 8%) fall very short of their demands, drawn up on the basis on real living costs, which the workers in Burkina Faso are finding increasingly difficult to endure.
