Massive protest march in Brussels rejects European austerity plans

More than 100,000 trade unionists from throughout Europe took to the streets of Brussels on 29 September to oppose austerity measures which, if governments do not change direction, will have disastrous social and economic results. The European Federation of Public Service Unions led hundreds of members from several countries, saying "No to austerity - Priority for jobs and growth!" and "Against cuts in public services!" and calling for public investment on public services.

Under the Sarkozy government, the proposed pension reform will push the minimum retirement age from 60 to 62. This will affect women, in particular, as many women take extended breaks in their professional careers in order to raise families or take care of elders.
