# Consultation on ICJ Report – A Convention on Business and Human Rights? 23 April 2014, Geneva, Switzerland



26th Session of the UN Human Rights Council 10 to 27 June, Geneva, Switzerland This session of the HRC will have a strong focus on women's rights and also deal with the renewal of the mandate of the Working Group on Business and Human Rights. Often postponed, we are also expecting a follow-up resolution on climate change and human rights, so many priority areas for FES will be addressed at this session. Side events to be announced.







This annual outreach event brings together government officials, civil society representatives, academics, the private sector and other stakeholders to engage in a dialogue on critical issues in trade and development.



#### 103rd Session of the International Labour Conference (ILC) 28 May to 12 June 2014, Geneva

The ILC is the ILO's highest decision-making body. It meets annually in June, bringing together the tripartite delegations from the Organization's 185 member States. Specific agenda items, aside of the implementation of Conventions and Recommendations will be a) to advance standard setting in supplementing the Forced Labour

Convention, 1930 (No. 29); b) Facilitating transitions from the informal to the formal economy; and c) a discussion on the strategic objective of employment.
