Top 10



The SDLP wants to build a new Ireland of equality, justice and prosperity.

We will work to:

- 1 Demand the full implementation and development of the Good Friday Agreement. The SDLP will not renegotiate the Agreement with any political party.
- 2 Seek a referendum on Irish unity within the lifetime of the next Assembly.
- 3 Confront Sectarianism, creating new laws on sectarian graffiti, kerb-painting & flag-flying and tougher penalties for sectarian crime.

- 4 Invest in new business, business growth and social economy enterprises: create a new "Enterprise Growth Fund" to increase the number of business start-ups and assist non profit-making enterprises to become self-sustaining.
- 5 Create a new **anti-poverty strategy** and secure a comprehensive **Bill of Rights** including social and economic rights.
- 6 Move quickly to replace the "Eleven plus" and academic selection with a transfer system based on choice and equality of opportunity leading to high quality all-ability education for all.
- 7 Tackle waiting lists by restructuring the health service to reduce bureaucracy and maximise front-line resources and invest in community care to reduce "bed-blocking".
- 8 Change the face of government, bringing in the unions, business and the voluntary sector to agree a five-year programme for government and introducing reforms to spend less on bureaucracy and more on public services.
- 9. Deliver more **police officers on patrol**, faster response times and better clear up rates for crime.
- 10 Tackle the shortage in supply of social housing: overhaul supply and planning responsibilities to overcome the gross failure to meet "new build" targets.

Top 10 All-Ireland



The SDLP is 100% committed to the Agreement and 100% committed to a United Ireland. We believe that all-Ireland development will benefit all communities, North & South. In addition to the referendum on unity referred to above, we will work to:

1 Create an all-Ireland Transport & Infrastructure Body to produce and implement a strategic development framework networking air and sea-ports and economic corridors across the island.

- 2 Create a new all-Ireland Food Marketing body to promote our excellent local produce, capitalising on the clean, green image of Ireland.
- 3 Establish a new all-Ireland Research Alliance to work with universities, colleges and other institutions to operate a "mix and match" service with businesses to generate economic benefits from new research as quickly as possible.
- 4 Deliver the all-Ireland Charter of Rights to promote the highest level of human rights protection throughout the island and promote all-Ireland co-operation on tackling child poverty.
- 5 Establish a North-South Further & Higher Education body to encourage collaboration in policy, teaching, research, evaluation, recognition of qualifications and models of excellent practice.
- 6 Create an all-Ireland Criminal Assets Bureau, modelled on the Criminal Assets Bureau in the South, to deprive criminals of their wrongful gains without fear or favour throughout the island.
- 7 Agree all-Ireland free-travel for pensioners through mutual recognition of schemes North and South.
- 8 Commission an all-Ireland framework for investing in early-years provision, both statutory and community-based, including special needs.
- Advance North-South co-operation to create an all-Ireland Sex Offenders register.
- 10 Create an **all-Ireland Public Safety Body** to promote a safety culture throughout the island and to systematically reduce accidents across all government departments and all sectors.

Top 10 for balanced and sustainable growth



The SDLP is committed to addressing the decades of under-investment across the North, particularly in rural areas and promoting balanced and sustainable growth across the North.

We will work to:

- 1 Decentralise government functions and agencies including 2000 jobs to towns across the North within 5 years, targeting areas of high unemployment and promoting balanced regional development.
- 2 Expand focus of Regional Transportation Strategy to address needs across the North and secure investment for

upgrading of key roads and rail-links including the Derry-Belfast road and major routes in the South-East and South-West.

- 3 **Protect farmers and rural interests in CAP Reform**; investigate merits of a hybrid system to protect vulnerable sectors from perceived dangers of full de-coupling.
- 4 **Expand Rural Transport initiatives** particularly Demand Responsive Transport (e.g. community taxis, "rural rover" bus services).
- 5 Campaign for entry to the Euro-zone a key priority in raising farm incomes
- 6 **Develop a new cross-cutting Rural White Paper**, a comprehensive plan to promote job and wealth-creation, improve social inclusion and access to services and strengthen the fabric of rural society.
- 7 Legislate for a 10p tax on plastic bags to help protect the environment.
- 8 **Overhaul planning policy** to enable diversification and development of rural businesses such as agri-tourism.
- 9 Invest in quality, accessible health and social care including quality acute services for every county.
- 10 Expand the gas network on an East-West and South-North basis and explore a role for farmers in increasing our supply of renewable energy, (e.g. willow production) especially in areas outside the gas network.

Top 10 for solidarity across generations



The SDLP is the party of rights and equal opportunities, committed to the creation of a fairer, shared society.

- Ensure that the new anti-poverty strategy specifically addresses child poverty, pensioner poverty and fuel poverty, the latter a particular problem for all too many young families and pensioner households.
- 2 Grow the Children's Fund and expand the Social Inclusion Fund to support development and delivery of local services to children and older people. The new measures under the SIF to support schools in areas of social need and provide

funding for community services for older people.

- 3 Deliver sustained investment in **pre-school provision** through both the community and statutory sectors, recognising that early years intervention supports families and communities, provides lifetime benefits to children and long-term returns to society.
- 4 Improve support for families with children with a disability, including appointment of a named support person to help families to access all relevant support services.
- 5 Extend financial support for learning throughout life and oppose topup fees so that finance is no barrier to education and a skills deficit no impediment to our economy.
- 6 Support young households, tackling housing affordability, including extension of the co-ownership scheme and developing high quality, affordable childcare schemes in partnership with the community & voluntary sector, the commercial child-minding sector and employers.
- 7 Extend the children's half-price travel scheme to 16-18 year-olds in fulltime education and extend concessionary travel to people with disabilities.
- 8 Implement and improve the Valuing Carers Strategy, research the levels and types of need including those of elderly and young carers and appoint a named contact/support person to advise and assist on accessing benefits and services.
- 9 Outlaw age discrimination while extending additional concessions to older people, such as rate relief.
- 10 Introduce free personal care, building on SDLP success in budgeting for free nursing care.

Since the last Assembly elections, the SDLP has delivered an unequalled record on issues that matter to you

- 1 Drove creation of the "Executive Programme Funds" to fund community regeneration, investment in infrastructure, public services and economic innovation.
- 2 Delivered an additional £687 million to the health budget

- an increase of over 37%, including funds for free nursing care.

- 3 Delivered a £77 million student finance package reintroducing grants and cutting the numbers liable for fees to less than half students now agree it is the best package on these islands.
- 4 Tackled Foot and Mouth disease swiftly and decisively and initiated development of an all-Ireland animal health strategy.
